

Among his exploits were the capture of the Ingram Partisan Rangers, Confederate sympathizers and stagecoach robbers, in a shoot-out near the New Almaden quicksilver mines, and the pursuit and hanging of California's most wanted bandido, Tiburcio Vasquez.




MAYOCK HOUSE AND CHAPEL AT GAVILAN COLLEGE

Around 1980 the Society paid for moving the historic Mayock House from East Sixth Street to Gavilan College. An agreement at the time specified that the carpentry students would restore the house for use by the Faculty Association and the Society would retain use of one room for an office and occasional Society meetings. We have appreciated that privilege, but haven't been able to use the house since 2017 because the facilities administrator said the Department of the State Architect (which must approve all school buildings) said the Mayock House and chapel (moved to campus from Dunneville) did not meet seismic safety standards. Prior to this we understood that as long as students didn't use these buildings they were acceptable to the State.

Our board and member **Rick Santos** (retired from Gavilan maintenance staff) have been concerned about both buildings being empty and unused. In November **Rick**, **Joanie Lewis** and **Connie Rogers** met with Dr. Pedro Avila, new President of Gavilan, and Jeff Gopp, Gavilan's head of maintenance. We had a very constructive discussion and agreed that both buildings are important to the college. The first step must be to clarify what standards historic buildings on campus must meet and under what conditions in order to be usable.

Research Room Named in Honor of Claudia Kendall Salewske

Claudia was a teacher, author, and an active member of the Gilroy Historical Society. Using our reference room she wrote two books about Gilroy history; **Pieces of the Past** (1982) and **Gilroy** (2003). She developed the third-grade local history curriculum, including a teachers' manual. For seven years Claudia volunteered twice a month at the Gilroy Museum, making a significant contribution to Gilroy's history through her scholarship and research. On December 7th we were proud to name the research room in her honor with a handsome new plaque.

Goodbye 2022 and Hello 2023!

Like Janus. the Romans' mythological two faced god, the end of one year and the beginning of another often spurs reflections and new aspirations. At the close of each year, the Gilroy Museum summarizes its accomplishments in terms of its monthly statistics. The museum keeps records on its interaction with the public and its internal Museum projects. Together these measurements give a picture ofcustomers served and progress made in maintaining and organizing the Gilroy Museum. Due to publication deadlines, only 11 months are captured in the table below, so the final 2022 statistics will be somewhat larger.

As the table shows, there has been plenty to do in 2022. Another year though, brings new opportunities and a host of new jobs. In 2023, the Museum Volunteers will be busy supporting established public programs and working to ensure a more organized collection. The list of Museum projects includes:

- Assembling and organizing new storage for framed photographs and art works,
- Completing the Objects Collection audit and revising the associated database records,
- Developing and executing a plan for reorganizing the basement storage area,
- Reordering the photographs stored in the newly renamed Claudia Kendall Salewske Research Room and updating their database records,
- Researching and evaluating artifacts considered for removal by the Collection Committee,
- Revising and creating new displays,
- Processing research requests and
- Integrating the Museum's history files more fully into the Museum's database program.

Of course, meeting the 2023 goals is dependent on having dedicated volunteers who enjoy serving their community and telling Gilroy's story. Volunteers do it all from taking snap shots of artifacts for visual records to photographing children posing in bonnets and hats of the 1890's. If you like putting things in order, the Museum Collection comprises about 25,000 items that need to be checked, filed, recorded and verified. Is finding answers or doing historical research your cup of tea? Gilroy is the third oldest city in the county, and at 150 years and counting, there are a plethora of topics to choose. If you're a people person, opportunities exist to meet and greet visitors, give Museum tours, and collaborate with your fellow volunteers. Just want to get out of the house and do something different? Become a Museum volunteer and we'll make sure you are prepared for and comfortable with your assignment! With dedicated volunteers, the Gilroy Museum can achieve its goals. Come join the Museum team in 2023!


