





Meet Our Museum Manager . . . SUSAN VOSS

Susan's agricultural roots go deep in Gilroy. Her family owned orchards of prunes, apricots and cherries in Gilroy since 1959. Five years later they moved to their farm on Holsclaw Road where Susan and her sisters grew up in one of Gilroy's most historic areas. She still lives there in an historic house! Can you envision the Voss sisters playing in the orchard and helping harvest the fruit? As a youngster Susan had a spotted pinto mare named Dixie and today still has an interest in horsemanship. Her parents imbued Susan with a lifelong interest in history. This was evident in their personal and civic life and was passed on to their daughters with trips to California history spots whenever her dad could get away from the orchard.

At UC Santa Barbara Susan majored in history which she says gave her the tools for critical thinking and minored

in English which taught her how to express those ideas. She later earned a teaching credential in Adult Ed at San Jose State and an MBA at National University. She has held a variety of jobs, including a stint as the assistant manager of the Gavilan Water District, which was later absorbed by the larger Santa Clara Valley Water District.

In 2003 Susan began working for the City of Gilroy in the Recreation Dept. and for a few years was the Museum Coordinator. When the City laid off all employees at the Museum in 2009 she became the City's Volunteer Coordinator, retiring in 2019. Then she promptly began volunteering at the Museum! The Society could not have found a more qualified person, by training, interest and dedication. Her life experiences and education are an excellent fit for this position. Recently she contributed an authentic costume with leather chaps which a friend wore while riding in the 1976 reenactment of the DeAnza Expedition. Now it greets Museum visitors as our newest exhibit!

Susan's MBA skills are valuable in managing the Museum budget and her organizational skills are making access to the collection much easier. She has several volunteers working on a major audit of the collection, reconciling old records on index cards and in Excel spreadsheets with our current Past Perfect software. New archival boxes have been filled and storage has been rearranged to make locating items much easier. Her teaching skills illuminate the many facets of the Museum's collection for volunteers and the public. Susan is not only meeting our goal of setting priorities for the Gilroy Museum, she is making it welcoming and more accessible. We are so fortunate to have a manager with her knowledge and abilities. Museum Volunteers Discover Time's Treasures

Do you ever wonder what Gilroy Museum volunteers do? Just ask **Karen Pedigo** who is pictured cleaning an American Legion Banner. Since aged artifacts require care, a group of volunteers is carefully examining each item, noting its condition, location, labeling, and reviewing its cataloging. In the picture, Karen holds the vacuum's nozzle brush above the banner and the gentle suction removes dust. Karen has been busy applying this same process to the museum's collection of period men's and women's clothing, while other volunteers have been working with everything from dishes and cutlery to toys and tools.

Volunteers have examined about 136 of the Museum's 600 artifact boxes. Each museum box holds a unique surprise, and like opening presents, when the lid comes off, you never know what treasures you may



find. If you enjoy surprises and exploring Gilroy's 150 years of memorabilia, come join the volunteers working with the collection. After all, there are still at least 464 boxes left to open! 






INTERPRETIVE SIGNS FOR THE MUSEUM
